Dear Families, Faculty, and Staff,

In an effort to remain fully transparent and keep our school community safe, we want to share that the County Board of Health confirmed that a student of Julie Billiard School Lyndhurst has tested positive for COVID-19. **The student has not been in school since his/her symptoms began during Thanksgiving break. Because the student has not been in school, the Cuyahoga County Board of Health has determined that there has been no exposure among our students, faculty, or staff.**

Due to [HIPPA and FERPA](#) guidelines, the identity of this individual is protected. We ask that you do not speculate or share information about this individual.

**What's Next?**

- The person diagnosed is being kept home from school until they are no longer infectious.
- More than ever, it is incredibly important that all students, faculty, and staff adhere to our [health and safety protocols](#) so that we can continue to offer a safe space for our kids to learn.
- To keep cases to a minimum, please check yourself (or your child) for symptoms before coming to school each day. Additionally, if you or your child is experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, keep your child at home from school and avoid other activities around other people.

While Julie Billiard Schools has performed nightly deep cleanings, adhered to social distancing guidelines, sanitized high-touch spaces between use, and followed all health and safety protocols, there are inherent risks when entering a communal building such as a school, which may result in being exposed to COVID-19. We ask for your understanding and cooperation as we navigate this situation.
